Subject: LABOR MANAGEMENT MEETING

The following topics are suggested for discussion at the next labor management meeting, which is tentatively scheduled for the week of August 17. This information is provided as an agenda for executive staff, PLEA, and City Personnel, and as information to Commanders/Administrators:

- 1. Court award and federal grant overtime. Per the federal auditor, this money must be paid and not held. In the case of court award OT, it must be on drug-related activities. PLEA suggests that it violates the MOU to let DEB employees volunteer for operations if they agree to get paid for the OT and not hold it, and exclude employees only because they wish to exercise their MOU right to hold OT.
- 2. Work hours in DEB. Is it an operational need to conserve OT to meet the demands of drug enforcement activity? Is the Department violating the MOU by changing work hours if an officer spends more than four hours in Court?
- 3. Employee negligence. If an employee loses issued equipment due to their own negligence, can they be required to pay for it? The Department's position is yes.
- Mandatory wearing of vests. The Department would like to see more officers wear their ballistic vests. This is for preliminary discussion to set the stage for an in-depth review of options at the Labor Management Retreat in December. Should the Department just make it mandatory? Should it be associated with a better Patrol uniform, i.e. polo shirts? Should it just be required on second and third shifts?
- 5. Batons. Should the Department make the carrying of them mandatory? Can the Department require that officers purchase them if they are a mandatory uniform item? Which Department units will have to carry them, i.e. Patrol, Motors, Gangs, SRO's?

Here are the topics we would like to bring to the table. If you have additional items to add please advise Greg Fretz and me.

INGERSOL/HAMLN/NAPIER/BOLTON

Investigative Review Process: Do the proposed changes do away with the advantages to having an IRP meting? How do we get agreement on the violations?

2. Tattoos: The Department proposes a policy that any tattoo has to be covered while on duty. Exceptions would be made only for undercover officers.

3. Shotgun certification proposed policy: If you can't qualify on the standard course and can't qualify (for medical or other reasons) with the stun bag weapon, you will be put into a non-enforcement position.

New Uniform Policy: Discussion and presentation of the new policy and the relationship to mandatory vest wear.

5. Drug Testing: Is there a need after a positive first test to go to a blood test at the second stage? Also, the Department proposes to make a drug/alcohol screen following any serious use of force incident.

6. Tobacco Usage: Should the Department adopt a policy that all new hires agree not to use tobacco products.
